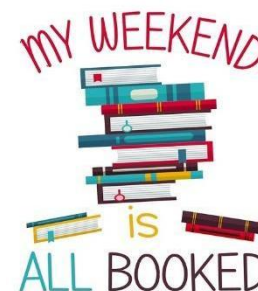




SFS READING ACTIVITIES

Write at least 5 sentences including subordinating conjunctions about events that have happened in the story you are reading.</p> <p>VCOP – Underline the Subordinating conjunctions in green</p> <p>'ISAWAWABUB' -if, so, as, when, although, while, after, before, unt</p>	<p>2. Choose your favourite character from the book you are reading. Create a list of similes to describe their appearance and personality.</p> <p>Asas a Like a</p>	<p>3. Write a letter to Mrs Redman and Mrs Bishop persuading them to read a book you have enjoyed to the whole class.</p> <p>Remember to use a wide variety of persuasive openers in your letter.</p> <p>VCOP – Underline these openers in blue e.g. In my opinion, I believe that, It is clear that etc</p>	<p>4. Choose some verbs from the story you are reading. Find as many synonyms as you can for each verb e.g. said - replied, cried, murmured</p>
<p>5. Find examples of adverbs in the story you are reading. Make a list of them. Could you choose an alternative adverb to slot in the sentence that retains the meaning</p> <p>e.g. Cautiously, she approached the cave. Nervously, she approached the cave.</p>	<p>6. Write a newspaper article about one of the key events in a story you have enjoyed reading. We did this for 'I Was a Rat' so you have got some experience of this.</p> <p>Remember: headline, pictures and captions, past tense, quotes (direct and reported speech) 3 main paragraphs</p>	<p>7. Write down at least 8 facts you have learnt from a non-fiction book you have read.</p>	<p>8. Tell the key events of the story you have just read through a series of haikus. We did this for the Christmas Story.</p> <p>Remember a haiku has 3 lines with a syllable count of 5,7,7</p>
<p>9. As you are reading, keep a record of any new and unfamiliar words. Find their meaning in a dictionary and record this to share with the class.</p>	<p>10. Write a book review of a story you have enjoyed reading. We have some book review templates in class if you'd like to use one - just ask.</p>	<p>11. Write a description of the setting in the book you are reading.</p> <p>Remember to use a wide variety of adjectives in your description.</p> <p>VCOP – Underline the adjectives in red</p>	<p>12. Choose some words from a non fiction book you have read to make your own glossary.</p>
