

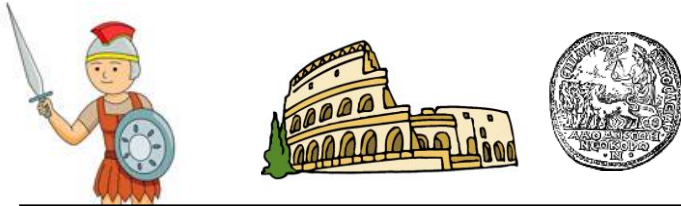
Year 3/4 Homework: Roman Britain

Homework is an important part of your child's academic learning. Please support your child by supporting them with their homework by helping them, sitting with them and showing interest in what they have been learning.



Choose a times table that you have learnt and write it out using Roman numerals. 	The Romans loved to grow herbs for medicines. Grow a type of herb and keep a diary of its progress. You might like to use a graph, photos or observational notes. E.g. Rosemary.	Create 10 maths word problems for Roman children. Make sure you use Roman numerals in your calculations. You must also provide an answer sheet, which shows your workings out. Remember to make them challenging	Draw or paint a picture of a Roman artefact. E.g. Oil lamp, bust, coin, chariot, etc	Research and draw a Roman soldier or a Celtic warrior. Label their uniform, equipment and weapons.
Write a list of 10 questions that you would ask a Roman Soldier who has come to Britain	Write a list of 5 different Roman Emperors and the dates of their reign.	Would you prefer to be a Roman or a Celt? Explain in detail which one you would choose and give 4 reasons for your choices.	Create a fact file or PowerPoint on the Roman Gods. This should include details about at least 5 gods.	Retell the story of a Roman myth or legend and present it as a comic strip. E.g. Romulus and Remus, Androcles and the Lion.
MUST DO Design and make a Roman shield for our Roman Day. You will need to research the design, colours and shape so that it is authentic. Your shield should be A2 size. (594mm x420mm)	Create your own Roman quiz including at least 5 questions. Challenge your family, friends and classmates to answer them.	FREE	Be a Roman Emperor! Design and make a 3D coin with your portrait and date of birth on it. What materials could you use to make it?	Find a traditional Roman recipe. Cook your tasty Roman treat and take a photo to show your creation. Write out the recipe and evaluate what you have made. What did you think of it? What did your family think of it?
Design and make a weapon for a Roman soldier. Research the types of weapons used and the materials they were made from carefully. Evaluate it.	Research and make a list of the names of at least 5 different Roman instruments.	Make a Mosaic using a programme on the computer/ Ipad, or use art materials.	Make a list of objects that we use now that the Romans used. Include at least 6 things in your list	Write a postcard from a Roman child living in Britain. Where have they been? Who are they writing to? What have they seen? How is Britain different to Rome?
Research a Roman invention that is still used today. E.g. Roads, aqueduct, sewage systems, central heating (hypocaust) Use Microsoft Word to produce a fact page about the invention.	Research, design and make your own Roman Ballista (catapult). Bring in your model or a photo of it and your design.	Create a model of a Roman musical instrument. E.g. A tibia, cornu, lyre or sistra. Design it and make it in the materials of your choice.	Draw a map of Roman Britain and include key features such as Hadrian's wall.	Visit a Roman site and write/film a report of your findings.
